English 200: King Arthur **FINAL EXAM**Take-Home Portion

This 1000-1500 word paper is due at the beginning of the in-class final exam (Wednesday, December 18th, 11:30-2:30, W01-004). The paper should be comprised of the following two parts:

- 1. An imaginative revision (at least 500 words) of a course text from your blog avatar's point of view. This revision could be approached in a variety of ways. You could insert your author/character into the story itself, write a new ending/beginning/episode for the text from your avatar's perspective, or even compose a traditional literary analysis in your author/character's voice. Eligible texts are any on the syllabus. The paper may be written in any genre (book review, short story, political tract, dream vision, etc.) but should focus on one scene, idea, word, topic, etc. in the text that would be of special interest to the character.
- 2. A reflection on your revision (at least 500 words) from *your* point of view. In this section, you should justify your approach and revision based on your understanding of your character, your selected text, or Arthurian literature in general. Also, discuss the experience of writing from your avatar's perspective, not only for this assignment but also for the course blog. How has the assumption of this voice enriched or limited your responses to literature? How might you have responded to this text differently if you were writing from your, not your author/character's, perspective?

Writing Process Suggestions

To write a paper that successfully engages with a specific topic, you might consider choosing passages from your text that interest you and for which you can establish some basis for a substantial, provocative, and interesting analysis and/or creative elaboration. That is, they may deal with the same subject or theme, use similar words or phrases, or share some interesting rhetorical or aesthetic characteristic. Remember: whatever genre you choose, your paper should be an interpretation of the text by your character/author. This paper must be 1000-1500 words long (12 pt. Times, double spaced, 1" margins). LIST THE FINAL WORD COUNT AT THE TOP OF THE PAPER.
